

1. The Antoš Craft Brewery

Antoš beers are characterized by their distinctive flavour and uncommon names with interesting tales to tell. For example, the "Rarach" is named after the sly and mischievous goblin fabled to live beneath the brewery to this day. By the way, you can visit the 13th century cellars if you book a tour in advance. So make sure the Rarach doesn't knock you out! You can while away the time waiting for your foamy brew or delicious treats in the Antoš tavern by playing with Antoš special playing cards. And if you are still undecided, just think of the regular choice of beers supplemented with up to 18 specials per season.

2. Berounský medvěd ('The Beroun Bear') Brewery

The 'bear named' town of Beroun is one of the oldest historical sites to be found on maps of Bohemia. When in 1295 King Wenceslas II elevated it to the rank of a Royal City, he also granted the burghers brewing and malting rights. The fulsome beverage was brewed here for more than 500 years before the former regime ended the tradition in 1978. Not for long, though, for twenty years later, the Mayer couple revived the tradition in Beroun's former sugar refinery. One thing to note is that the craft brewery has its own malt house in nearby Suchomasty.

3. Černokostelecký Brewery

If you've had your fill of brewhouses with copper boilers and tiled rooms, head to the Černokostelecký brewery where you'll be greeted by a bunch of enthusiasts who bought the ailing brewery and turned it into a unique brewery museum. They will show you the technological facilities of the 1930s, the only surviving still functional sprinkler in the Czech Republic, a steam engine, a cooper's workshop, a historical horse-mill and other paraphernalia from our great-grandfathers' days. You can also visit one of the traditional events, to help you master the down-to-earth craft of brewing.

4. Royal Brewery Krušovice

This erstwhile 16th century brewery for the Nobility was bought in 1583 by Emperor Rudolf II, who added it to the Křivoklát estate. The brewery thus gained the title of the sole Royal brewery in the Czech lands, supplying beer to Prague Castle. Beer has been brewed in Krušovice without a break for more than 430 years and is on tap practically all over the Czech Republic. Krušovice beer enjoys the 'Czech beer' protected marquee.

5. Měšťanský ('The Burghers') Brewery in Kutná Hora

The ossuary, the Cathedral of St. Barbara, silver mines, historic houses, medieval atmosphere, UNESCO; if these are not reasons enough to visit Kutná Hora, we have an insider's tip for you. A brewery, first founded in 1573 by Mikuláš Dačický of Heslov has reopened its doors. In 2015, the run-down premises found a new owner, and with it the revival of a more than 400 year tradition of brewing beer in Kutná Hora. To experience a genuine and unforgettable beer-fest and sample some uncommon specialties, head for Kutná Hora in the beer-fest period. In the peaceful setting of Kutná Hora, you'll enjoy the delights of your Czech brew all the more.

6. Němý Medvěd ('The Mute Bear') Craft Brewery

The idea of founding the first microbrewery in Mělník was the brainchild of two friends, Peter and Martin. In 2012 they opened the Mute Bear Beer Bar, which they fondly refer to as the den. They started out by offering their guests beer from competitors, but since 2015 have added their own to the list. Now you have a choice of four local original brews. Come and taste their acclaimed burgers, freshly made for you in the den, and wash them down with one of their bear beers. We do recommend booking ahead.

7. Všerad Brewery

Visit Všeradice for a great beer experience and more! The birthplace of Martha Stewart, born Magdalena Dobromila Rettigová, comes to life again after years of disrepair. In addition to the inn, museum and mini-golf course, don't forget to visit the courtyard brewery. The water from which the beer is brewed comes from an underground karst lake, which feeds a local well. And those wondering about the beauty of the surrounding Czech Karst area can stay the night in the castle courtyard. And if you are still unsure, you may be tempted by one of the many regular events held here.

8. Oliva's Brewery

Beer is good for the mind and the body. You can make sure of that in the Oliva family brewery in Dolní Břežany. The brewery and restaurant, guesthouse and beer baths were lovingly established in 2015 by Mr Oliva and his family. Come and relax in the beer bath, tempered to 36°C, or be pampered with a relaxing massage. The brewery is situated in the former historical stables in the middle of the village, contrasting with the modern HILASE laser centre nearby.

9. Lobeč Steam-powered Brewery

When in 2007 the Prouzovi couple set out on a romantic trip to the Kokořín district, little did they expect to turn their life upside down. Yet in the village of Lobeč they fell in love with the decaying building of a steam-powered brewery dating from the late 16th century. They abandoned their settled life in Prague and embarked on extensive renovation of this technical heritage site. In 2015 the brewery opened its gates to the public, and resumed the 500-year Lobeč tradition of beer brewing. During the tour, conducted by Mr Prouza himself, you'll learn about the history of the brewery, brewing beer, but also how following your dreams can turn them into reality. In the autumn of 2015 the building was awarded the prestigious heritage award Patrimonium pro futuro. Today, 14 beer varieties are brewed here, one of which has placed in the World's Best Beers Encyclopedia 2017.

10. Hubertus Kácov Brewery

The surface of the Sázava River mirrors the graceful building of one of the oldest of Czech breweries, founded back in 1457. The brewery's heyday came in the early 20th century under the management of the Austrian Emperor Charles I. Back then, the beer brewed in Kácov already bore the brand name Hubertus. The devastation of the building caused by the closure of the brewery buildings after World War II was put right by the current owner, who bought the building in 2001 and resumed the Kácov brewing tradition. Hubertus has become a popular stop for riverboaters and lovers of genuine Czech beer.

11. Klášter ('The Monastery') Brewery

The privilege of brewing beer in times long past did not only rest with royal towns and town houses, but also with monasteries, as was the case here. The name of the brewery is linked to the Cistercian order, who founded a monastery here in the 12th century. However, the first beer was not brewed until 1570. Three centuries later, the Klášter brewery was one of the largest breweries in all the Czech lands. The brewery closed and production moved in 2020, but you can still taste the beer in the restaurant, which is located 18 metres below the brewery.

12. Kytín Brewery

The village square seems straight out of a Josef Lada picture, such is the centre of the village of Kytín in the Brdy mountains foothills. Complementing the village pond and the Church of the Assumption, 2017 saw the addition of a new dominant feature – a brewery and restaurant where hungry wayfarers can eat, and lovers of the amber nectar get their fill. On the menu you'll find the best of our grandmothers' cookbooks have to offer. All the dishes are lovingly prepared with due regard to seasonal and local ingredients. Don't tarry and come to dine, to enjoy treats like the smokey Kytínský doutník 13° brew.

13. Nymburk Brewery

Are you bored? Then buy a raccoon!, was the slogan of the Nymburk brewery. Although the movie Postržížny (Cutting it Short) was filmed in the Dačice brewery, the book it is based on refers to the original Nymburk brewery where the writer Bohumil Hrabal spent his childhood. Follow in the footsteps of this Czech writer, inspired by the atmosphere of the local brewery, and sample the Postržížny beer flavour along the way. Of course, responsible drivers have the option of the local non-alcoholic beer with the double-meaning name of Střížlík ('a sober little wren').

14. Podlesí Brewery

After a day of wandering around the Brdy heights you're sure to appreciate somewhere to get your strength back. One such place is the Podlesí microbrewery in the village of that name in the Brdy foothills. Their beer and food is prepared with love and all wayfarers are treated as welcome guests. There's good news for drivers; all the Podlesí beers are also available in bottles to buy and take home. If you do succumb to the temptations and aromas of local beer, there are 10 rooms on the top floor to sleep it off. If you'd like to see how the Podlesí beers are made, you can book a tour and brighten up your local visit even more.

15. Velké Popovice Brewery

The picturesque Velké Popovice brewery is linked to Baron František Ringhoffer II, heir to the Ringhoffer enterprises particularly known for construction of trams, railway wagons and steam equipment for breweries. The fine neo-Gothic building of the brewery was completed in 1874, one year after the death of its founder. This is the only remaining works still going out of the famous family's industrial portfolio. In addition to daily tours you can take up the Kozel ('billygoat') apprenticeship school of beer-pulling, and gain your Kozel certificate. At the end of your outing, you can get to meet the brewery's living mascot – the billygoat Olda.

16. Řevnice Brewery

The year was 2019 when the former Řevnice railway station came back to life again. The elegant building has gained a new use. As part of the Corso Řevnice project, an honest craft brewery was established here, headed by Roman Rezáč. The young brewer started his brewing career working in a finance department and has come a long way since brewing his first batch of home-made beer in a plain pot. Locals, passers-by and cyclists can today find refreshment here during their travels through the Bohemian Karst or Brdy hill range.

17. Na Vývoji ('The Developing') Brewery

One of the newest additions in Central Bohemia is a microbrewery called Na Vývoji, opened in 2018. You can find it within a complex of the same name, a renovated former factory for packing machines. The industrial space not far from the legendary knights of Blaník mountain brews 5 beer varieties that you can taste in their restaurant or take home. In addition to the restaurant, we can recommend making use of the hotel and sports facilities.

18. Přátelský pivovar Malešov ('The Malešov Friendly Brewery')

On the banks of the Vrchlice reservoir is a 14th century Gothic fortress. Its modern history began in 2002, when a group of friends decided to breathe new life into the run-down bastion. 'The order was clear – the fortress must not fall, whatever the cost.' So, after tens of thousands of hours of work, the fortress rose again in its Gothic splendour, inviting the public to find out how life was lived in the middle ages. Another objective was to restore the tradition of brewing beer in Malešov and to save the old brewery cellars. This 'order to the troops' was also met by the Malešov enthusiasts, giving you the unmissable opportunity to visit their craft brewery, whose enchanting friendly atmosphere invites repeat visits.

19. Říčany Brewery

Let us revisit Lada country one more time. The last and youngest brewery in this enchanting region is to be found in Říčany near Prague. It owes its existence to the Kantor family, who established the brewery on the site of a former homestead. You can combine your visit with a look around the ruins of one of the oldest Czech castles, with a tour of the museum or on hot days with a refreshing dip in the Jureček natural lido.

20. Únětice Brewery

In 2011 the Tkadlec couple revived the nearly 400-year tradition of brewing beer in Únětice. Back then they took over a dilapidated brewery building that served as a warehouse for milk products, and began extensive reconstruction. The year date carved on one of the pillars in the former malt house dates the brewery in all likelihood back to 1710. These days the site hosts the Brewery Pub, where you can quench your thirst with an unfiltered 10° or sample something tasty from the brewery's speciality dishes. Tours are by prior arrangement.
